Harbor Seals!

Location: Can be seen throughout Washington and Oregon! There are ~15,000 in Washington inland waters alone!

Size: Males and Females range from 4-6 ft. and a maximum of 310 pounds.

Diet: Rockfish, cod, herring, flounder, and salmon.


Gestation: 10 months.

Lactation: Weaned at 4-6 weeks, milk is 50% fat.

Behavior: Seal pups are temporarily left on shore while their mother forages for food. If you see a seal pup alone on the beach, the best thing to do is stay 100 yards away from the animal!

Sleep: Haul out at night and during the day; they have the ability to sleep underwater and come up for air once every 30 minutes!

Locomotion: On land harbor seals drag themselves along using their front flippers in a "caterpillar" like motion.
