






# Snake River Recovery Plan Management Unit Boundaries




# Snake River Spring/Summer Chinook Populations of Oregon




# Snake River Summer/Winter Steelhead Populations of Oregon






# NE Oregon Snake River Management Unit Plan

- Goal: Consistent with ESA recovery plan requirements and Oregon's Native Fish Conservation Policy
- Scope: Address all limiting factors and threats
- Use ICTRT status assessment, biological viability criteria and MPG scenarios to meet criteria
- Broad sense recovery goals go beyond delisting
- Delisting: ESU and DPS-level biological criteria and threats criteria will be in Snake River roll-up Plan



# Status of Draft NE Oregon Management Unit Plan

- Background: NMFS La Grande Office had lead, with Grande Ronde Model Watershed
- 2008 draft Recovery Plan had habitat focus
- 2010 NMFS formed Technical Team
- Added new information: tributary recovery strategies, hatchery and harvest actions, adaptive management, RM&E, and implementation chapters
- Expanded Sounding Board with broader participation
- Complete draft Plan to Tech Team in November 2010



## Next Steps

- Tech Team meeting in February 2012 to review status of draft Plan
- NMFS will endorse draft Plan
- Work with ODFW, Tribes, GRMW, BPA, TAC and Sounding Board to implement draft Plan
- Track and report on recovery action implementation
