PACIFIC COAST GROUND FISH FISHERY Changes to commercial and recreational management measures

The National Marine Fisheries Service (NMFS) announces changes to commercial and recreational management measures for the Pacific Coast groundfish fishery off Washington, Oregon, and California, **effective at 0001 hours (local time) May 1, 2007.**

The Pacific Fishery Management Council (Pacific Council) recommended changes to management measures at their March 5-9, 2007, meeting in Sacramento, CA. Changes to management measures were implemented in a Federal Register notice that published on April 18, 2007 (72 FR 19390), and are described in this public notice. At its April 2-6 meeting in Seattle, WA, the Pacific Council also recommended the 2007 halibut retention limit for the limited entry fixed gear fishery north of Point Chehalis, Washington.

Commercial Fishery

For complete regulations governing the commercial groundfish fishery, please see Title 50 CFR Part 660, Subpart G. Current trip limit tables, Tables 3-5 (North and South), are included at the end of this public notice.

Limited Entry Trawl Fishery

For more detailed regulations applying to the limited entry trawl fishery, see § 660.381 of the Pacific Coast groundfish regulations.

Non-tribal Limited Entry Trawl Fishery

Based on 2005 West Coast Groundfish Observer Program (WCGOP) data indicating higher than expected canary rockfish bycatch rates used selective flatfish trawl gear north of 40°10.00' N. lat., NMFS believes that the canary rockfish OY could be exceeded in 2007. Therefore, NMFS has implemented the following May 1 changes to limited entry trawl trip limits, recommended by the Pacific Council.

In addition, catch of Petrale sole in the limited entry trawl fishery was higher than expected in early 2007. Decreasing the cumulative limits for Petrale sole may provide fishing opportunity throughout the year. Therefore NMFS is decreasing Petrale sole cumulative limits coastwide.

Limited Entry Trawl Trip Limits North of 40°10' N. Lat.

NMFS will be decreasing cumulative limits for some species using selective flatfish trawl gear to keep canary rockfish within its 2007 OY.

- **North of 40°10 N. Lat.**, decrease sablefish trip limits using selective flatfish trawl gear to 5,000 lbs per 2 months from May through December;
- **North of 40°10 N. Lat.**, decrease Dover sole trip limits using selective flatfish trawl gear to 38,000 lbs per 2 months from May through October, and to 25,000 lbs per 2 months from November to December;
- **North of 40°10 N. Lat.**, decrease Petrale sole trip limits using selective flatfish trawl gear to 20,000 lb per 2 months from May to August, to 15,000 lb per 2 months from September to October, and to 8,000 lb per 2 months from November to December.

NMFS will be increasing cumulative limits for some species using large and small footrope gears to provide incentives to fish in areas of low canary rockfish abundance.

- **North of 40°10 N. Lat.**, increase lingcod trip limits using large and small footrope gear to 4,000 lb per 2 months from May through December;
- **North of 40°10 N. Lat.**, increase shortspine thornyheads trip limits using large and small footrope gear to 10,000 lb per 2 months from May through December.

NMFS will be decreasing cumulative limits for minor slope rockfish to keep darkblotched rockfish within the 2007 OY.

- **North of 40°10 N. Lat.**, decrease minor slope and darkblotched rockfish trip limits to 1,500 lb per 2 months from May through December.

NMFS will be decreasing cumulative limits for Petrale sole to keep Petrale sole within the 2007 OY and provide fishing opportunity throughout the year.

- **North of 40°10 N. Lat.**, decrease Petrale sole trip limits using large and small footrope trawl gear to 20,000 lb per 2 months from May to October, and to 30,000 lb per 2 months from November to December;

NMFS will be combining arrowtooth flounder limits within Other Flatfish limits to reduce overall catch and keep canary rockfish within the 2007 OY.

- **North of 40°10 N. Lat.**, decrease Other Flatfish, including arrowtooth flounder, trip limits using selective flatfish trawl gear, to 70,000 lb per 2 months from May to October, and to 30,000 lb per 2 months from November to December, and decrease Other Flatfish, including arrowtooth flounder, trip limits using large and small footrope trawl gears, to 110,000 lb per 2 months from May to December;

Limited Entry Trawl RCA North of 40°10' N. Lat.

NMFS issued a Public Notice on April 16, 2007 announcing changes to the limited entry trawl RCA. The following change, while included in the schedule of RCA boundaries at the end of that notice, was not described in that Public Notice. Effective April 17, 2007:

- **Between the U.S. Canada Border and 40°10 N. lat.**, the seaward boundary of the trawl RCA is shifted shoreward to a line approximating the Petrale modified 200 fm depth contour from November through December.

Limited Entry Trawl Trip Limits South of 40°10' N. Lat.

NMFS will be combining arrowtooth flounder limits within Other Flatfish limits to reduce overall catch.

- **South of 40°10 N. Lat.**, arrowtooth limits are combined with Other Flatfish into a single combined cumulative limit of 110,000 lb per 2 months from May to December.

NMFS will be increasing cumulative limits for lingcod using large footrope and midwater trawl gears to shift fishing effort to areas of low canary abundance and to reduce discards.

- **South of 40°10 N. Lat.**, increase lingcod trip limits using large footrope and midwater trawl gear to 4,000 lb per 2 months from May to December.

NMFS will be decreasing cumulative limits for Petrale sole to keep Petrale sole within the 2007 OY and provide fishing opportunity throughout the year.

- **South of 40°10 N. Lat.**, decrease Petrale sole trip limits to 25,000 lb per 2 months from May to October.

Limited Entry Longline Fishery

For more detailed regulations applying to the limited entry fixed gear primary sablefish fishery, see § 660.372 of the Pacific Coast groundfish regulations.

The Pacific halibut Catch Sharing Plan (CSP) and implementing regulations at 50 CFR 300.63(b)(3) provide for retention of halibut landed incidentally in the limited entry, longline primary sablefish fishery north of Pt. Chehalis, WA (46°53.30' N. lat.) in years when the Area 2A TAC is above 900,000 lb. The 2007 Area 2A TAC is 1,340,000 lb.

Longline vessels registered for use with longline-endorsed and sablefish-endorsed limited entry permits may participate in the primary fixed gear sablefish fishery specified for halibut retention in the CSP. Vessels must carry IPHC commercial halibut licenses in order to retain and land halibut. Incidental halibut retention in the primary sablefish fishery is only allowed for vessels operating north of Pt. Chehalis, WA (46°53.30' N. lat.). Halibut taken and retained in the primary sablefish fishery may not be possessed or landed south of Pt. Chehalis, WA (46°53.30' N. lat.).

Beginning May 1, 2007, and continuing until the halibut quota of 70,000 lb is taken, longliners

eligible to participate in the primary sablefish fishery north of Pt. Chehalis, WA (46°53.30' N. lat.) (see 50 CFR 660.372(a)) with appropriate IPHC licenses may retain incidental halibut landings up to 100 lb (dressed weight, head-on) of halibut for every 1,000 lb (dressed weight) of sablefish landed and up to two additional halibut in excess of the 100 lb per 1,000 lb ratio per landing. Halibut may not be on board a vessel that has any gear other than longline gear on board (e.g., pot or trawl gear).

Washington Recreational Fishery

For more detailed regulations applying to the recreational fisheries, see § 660.384 of the Pacific Coast groundfish regulations.

WDFW presented 2006 fishery information at the March 5-9, 2007 Council meeting. Based on this new information, WDFW recommended modifying the effective dates of the Washington Recreational RCAs. Therefore, in order to conform to recreational management measures in federal waters, NMFS is implementing:

- **Between the U.S. border with Canada and the Queets River**, recreational fishing for groundfish is prohibited seaward of a boundary line approximating the 20–fm depth contour from May 21 through September 30, except on days when the Pacific halibut fishery is open in this area; and
- **Between the Queets River and Leadbetter Point**, recreational fishing for groundfish is prohibited seaward of a boundary line approximating the 30–fm depth contour from March 17, 2007, through June 15, 2007, except that recreational fishing for sablefish and Pacific cod is permitted within the recreational RCA from May 1 through June 15. In 2008, recreational fishing for groundfish is prohibited seaward of a boundary line approximating the 30–fm depth contour in from March 15, 2008, through June 15, 2008, except that recreational fishing for sablefish and Pacific cod is permitted within the recreational RCA from May 1 through June 15.

**Trip limit tables, effective May 1, 2007,

Large footrope trawl gear is prohibited shoreward of the RCA. Midwater trawl gear is permitted only for vessels participating in the primary whiting season.
