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### PACIFIC COAST GROUND FISH FISHERY Changes to commercial management measures

The National Marine Fisheries Service (NMFS) announces changes to commercial management measures for the Pacific Coast groundfish fishery off Washington, Oregon, and California, **effective at 0001 hours (local time) August 1, 2008.**

The Pacific Fishery Management Council (Pacific Council) recommended changes to management measures at their June 6-13, 2008, meeting in Foster City, CA. Changes to management measures are being implemented in a Federal Register notice that published on July 24, 2008 (73 FR 43139), and are described in this public notice.

#### Commercial Fishery

For complete regulations governing the commercial groundfish fishery, please see Title 50 CFR Part 660, Subpart G. Current trip limit tables, Tables 3-5 (North and South), are included at the end of this public notice.

#### *Limited Entry Non-Whiting Trawl Fishery*

For more detailed regulations applying to the limited entry trawl fishery, see § 660.381 of the Pacific Coast groundfish regulations.

Catches of several target species are lower than expected in the area north of 40°10' N. lat. The Council considered increasing trip limits using both large footrope and selective flatfish trawl gear, while

balancing impacts to overfished species. Catches of petrale sole in the area north of 40°10' N. lat. is higher than expected, and the Council considered reducing the cumulative limit to prevent exceeding the 2008 petrale sole OY. Catches of sablefish are lower than expected coastwide in the limited entry trawl fishery and the Council considered increasing sablefish cumulative trip limits. Therefore, NMFS has implemented the following Pacific Council recommendations for changes to cumulative trip limits:

- **North of 40°10' N. lat.**, increase Dover sole trip limits using selective flatfish trawl gear to 50,000 lbs per 2 months from August through December;\*\*\*
- **North of 40°10' N. lat.**, increase other flatfish trip limits using selective flatfish trawl gear to 80,000 lbs per 2 months from August through December;
- **North of 40°10' N. lat.**, increase sablefish trip limits using selective flatfish trawl gear to 7,000 lb per 2 months from August through December;\*\*\*

- **North of 40°10' N. lat.**, decrease petrale sole trip limits using selective flatfish trawl gear to 16,000 lb per 2 months from September through October;
- **North of 40°10' N. lat.**, decrease petrale sole trip limits using large footrope trawl gear to 30,000 lb per 2 months from November through December;
- **Coastwide**, increase sablefish trip limits, using large footrope trawl gear in the north and all gears in the south, to 24,000 lbs per 2 months from August through October and to 19,000 lb per 2 months from November through December.

\*\*\* Please note that the trip limits in Table 3 (North) for sablefish and Dover sole using multiple trawl gears (lines 14 and 26) are inconsistent with the regulations at 50 CFR 660.381(c)(4)(i)(D) and with footnote 8/ of the Table. This section and footnote state that the trip limit when multiple gears are used during a cumulative limit period is the smaller of the limits for the different gear types. For sablefish and Dover sole, selective flatfish trawl trip limits are the most restrictive (lines 13 and 25), and the multiple trawl gear limits should have been modified to be equivalent to those limits (7,000 lb per two months and 50,000 lb per two months, respectively). NMFS is currently working to correct lines 14 and 26 of the Table in the Federal Register, to make the multiple trawl gear trip limit values for these species consistent with the definition of multiple bottom trawl gear cumulative trip limits.

#### ***Limited Entry Fixed Gear Sablefish Daily Trip Limit (DTL) Fishery***

For more detailed regulations applying to the limited entry fixed gear fishery, see § 660.382 of the Pacific Coast groundfish regulations.

Catch of sablefish in the limited entry fixed gear sablefish DTL fishery north of 36° N. lat. is lower than expected. The Pacific Council considered raising the daily trip limit to help industry members

offset the increased cost of fuel on a per trip basis, and preventing a large shift in effort by leaving the weekly and bi-monthly limits in place. Therefore, NMFS has implemented the following Pacific Council recommendations for August changes to the limited entry fixed gear sablefish DTL trip limits:

- **North of 36° N. lat.**, increase sablefish daily trip limits using large and small footrope gear to 500 lb per day, and keeping the weekly and bi-monthly limits at one landing per week of up to 1,000 lb, not to exceed 5,000 lb per two months from August through December.

#### ***Open Access Sablefish DTL Fishery***

For more detailed regulations applying to the open access fishery, see § 660.383 of the Pacific Coast groundfish regulations.

Caches of sablefish in the open access DTL fishery south of 36° N. lat. are higher than expected, likely due to an influx of displaced salmon fishers. The Pacific Council considered implementing monthly or bi-monthly cumulative limits to slow sablefish catches, and prevent exceeding the sablefish allocation in this area. Therefore, NMFS has implemented the following Pacific Council recommendations for changes to the sablefish DTL trip limits for the remainder of the year:

- **South of 36° N. lat.**, implement sablefish trip limits using large and small footrope gear of 1,000 lb per month, resulting in the cumulative limits of 300 lb per day, or one landing per week of up to 700 lb, not to exceed 1,000 lb from August 1 through August 31;
- **South of 36° N. lat.**, implement sablefish trip limits using large and small footrope gear of 2,100 lb per two months, resulting in the cumulative limits of 300 lb per day, or one landing per week of up to 700 lb, not to exceed 2,100 lb per two months from September through December.

**Trip limit tables, effective August 1, 2008,  
are included at the end of this public notice.**
