### PACIFIC COAST GROUNDFISH FISHERY

Changes to commercial and recreational fishery management measures

The National Marine Fisheries Service (NMFS) announces changes to commercial and recreational fishery management measures for the Pacific Coast groundfish fishery off Washington, Oregon, and California, effective January 1, 2012.

The Pacific Fishery Management Council (Council) recommended changes to management measures at their November 2-7 meeting, 2011 meeting in San Mateo, CA. Changes to management measures are being implemented in a *Federal Register* notice that will become effective on January 1, 2012. These changes are described in this public notice.

#### **Recreational Fishery**

**Washington State Lingcod Fishing Restricted Area** *Marine Area 1 and 2* 

Due bycatch of yelloweye rockfish and canary rockfish during 2011 from recreational targeting of lingcod, Washington State requested2012 federal regulations to conform to the state's emergency rule to close a portion of marine areas 1 and 2 to recreational lingcod fishing.

Therefore, in order to ensure that the recreational harvest guidelines for yelloweye and canary rockfish are not exceeded in 2012 and beyond, the Council recommended, and NMFS is implementing, a lingcod recreational fishery area closure as follows: lingcod fishing is prohibited year round, except in Marine Area 2 on days when the Pacific halibut fishery is open, in the area seaward (West) of a straight line connecting all of the following points in the order stated:

- (1) 47°31.70' N. lat., 124°45.00' W. long.;
- (2) 46°38.17' N. lat., 124°30.00' W. long.;
- (3) 46°38.17' N. lat., 124°21.00' W. long.; and
- (4) 46°25.00' N. lat., 124°21.00' W. long.



#### **Commercial Fishery**

#### Rockfish Conservation Areas

Vessels Using Groundfish Trawl Gear
The Council and NMFS considered an industry request to shift the seaward boundary of the trawl RCA shoreward to open some shallower areas for harvesting petrale. The potential risks and benefits were weighed of opening some shallower areas that

are currently closed by the trawl RCA where the fleet may have higher encounters with darkblotched rockfish, Pacific ocean perch, widow rockfish and yelloweye rockfish. However, there has been low catch of these species in 2011 and this change to the RCA structure would continue to give fishers additional chances to demonstrate the benefits of individual accountability that they have in the trawl rationalization program.

Therefore, the Council recommended and NMFS is implementing a shift in the seaward boundary of the trawl RCA for the area from 48°10' N. lat. (Cape Alava) to 45°46' N. lat. (Cape Falcon) by shifting the seaward boundary of the trawl RCA from the 200-fm line to the 150-fm line, beginning on March 1 through April 30 (period 2). The RCA boundary lines are defined by latitude and longitude coordinates at 50 CFR 660.71-74, and are available for download on the NMFS NWR website.

### Limited Entry Fixed Gear and Open Access Sablefish Daily Trip Limit (DTL) Fisheries

For complete regulations governing the limited entry fixed gear groundfish fishery, please see Title 50 CFR Part 660, subpart E. Current trip limit tables, Tables 2 (North and South), are included at the end of this public notice.

For complete regulations governing the open access groundfish fishery, please see Title 50 CFR Part 660, subpart F. The current trip limit tables, Table 3 (North and South) to subpart F, are included at the end of this public notice.

The Council considered the most recently available 2011 fishery data in order to develop appropriate and stable trip limits for each of these fisheries for 2012 such that catch of sablefish does not exceed the 2012 harvest specifications, and so that overfishing does not occur.

### <u>Limited Entry Fixed Gear Sablefish DTL Fishery</u> North of 36° N. Lat.

Therefore, the Council recommended and NMFS is implementing the following trip limits for 2012, which are anticipated to achieve, but not exceed the fishery harvest guideline for sablefish in 2012:

• Limited Entry Fixed Gear, North of 36° N. lat., to "1,300 lb per week, not to exceed 5,000 lb per 2 months" from January 1, through the end of the year.

See Table 2 (North) and Table 2 (South) to Subpart E, attached, for this change to sablefish trip limits.

Open Access Sablefish DTL Fishery North of 36° N. Lat.

Therefore, the Council recommended and NMFS is implementing the following trip limits for 2012, which are anticipated to achieve, but not exceed the fishery harvest guideline for sablefish in 2012:

Open Access, North of 36° N. lat., to "300 lb per day, or 1 landing per week of up to 900 lb, not to exceed 1,800 lb per 2 months" from January 1, through the end of the year.

See Table 3 (North) and Table 3 (South) to Subpart F, attached, for this change to sablefish trip limits.

### Limited Entry Fixed Gear and Open Access Sablefish DTL Fisheries South of 36° N. Lat.

Therefore, the Council recommended and NMFS is implementing the following trip limits for 2012, which are anticipated to achieve, but not exceed the fishery harvest guideline for sablefish in 2012:

- Limited Entry Fixed Gear, South of 36° N. lat., to "1,800 (817 kg) lb per week" in periods 1-6, on January 1, through the end of the year.
- Open Access, South of 36° N. lat., to "300 lb per day, or 1 landing per week of up to 1,350 lb, not to exceed 2,700 lb per 2 months" in periods 1-6, on January 1, through the end of the year.

See Table 2 (South) to Subpart E and Table 3 (South) to Subpart F, attached, for this change to sablefish trip limits.

### Limited Entry Fixed Gear and Open Access Minor Nearshore and Black Rockfish Trip Limits Between 42° N. lat. and 40°10.00' N. lat.

The Council considered the most recent limited entry fixed gear and open access nearshore fishery information, and recommended that the increased and re-structured limit that was implemented inseason during 2011, March-December (Periods 2-6), remain in place for the entire 2012 calendar year, beginning on January 1, 2012. The change allows for increased landings of black rockfish beginning in period 1, on January 1, 2012, through the end of the year.

Therefore, the Council recommended and NMFS is implementing an increase to the minor nearshore rockfish trip limit, between 42° N. lat. and 40°10' N. lat. from "6,000 lb per two months, no more than 1,200 lb of which may be species other than black or blue rockfish" to "8,500lb per two months, no more than 1,200 lb of which may be species other than black rockfish" beginning in period 1, on January 1 of 2012, through the end of the year.
